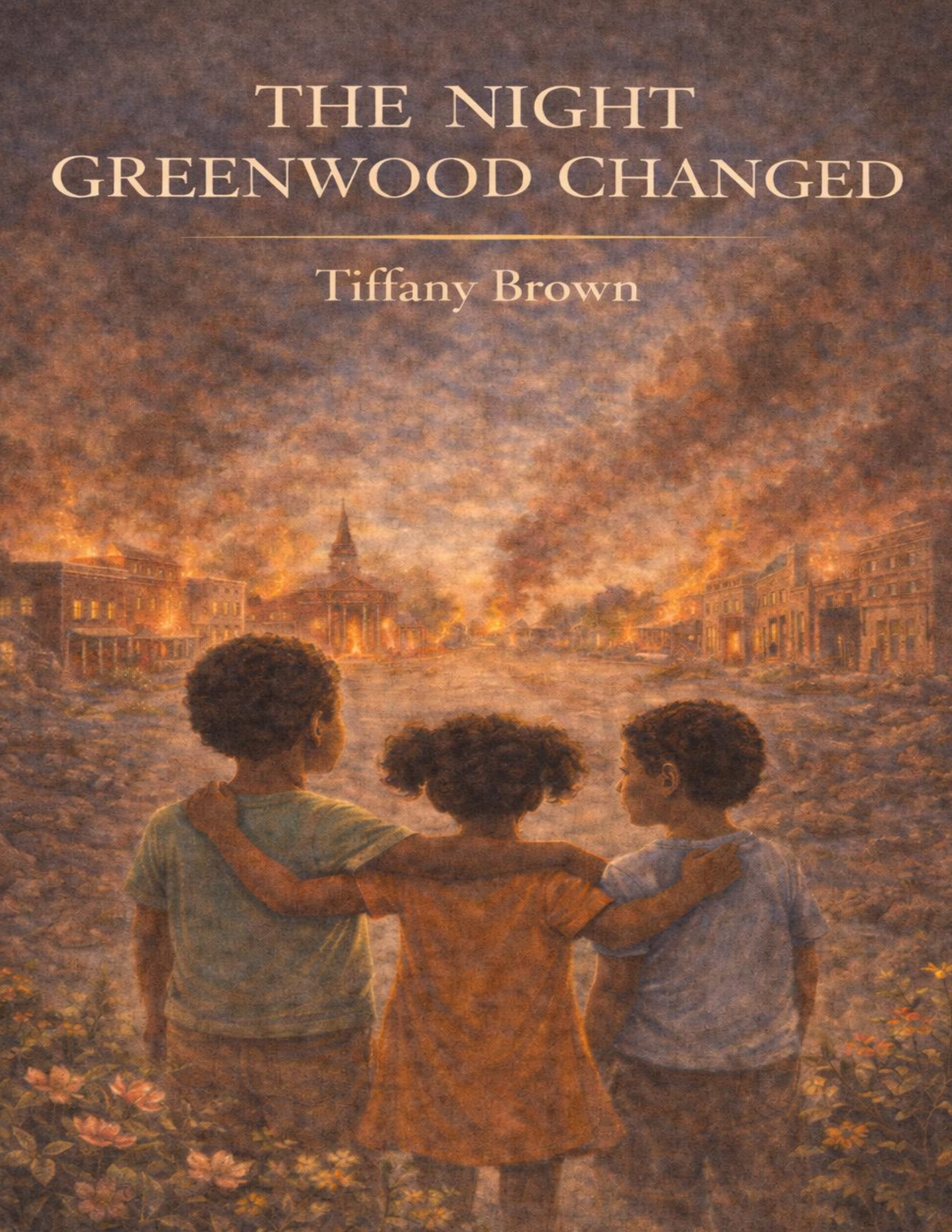

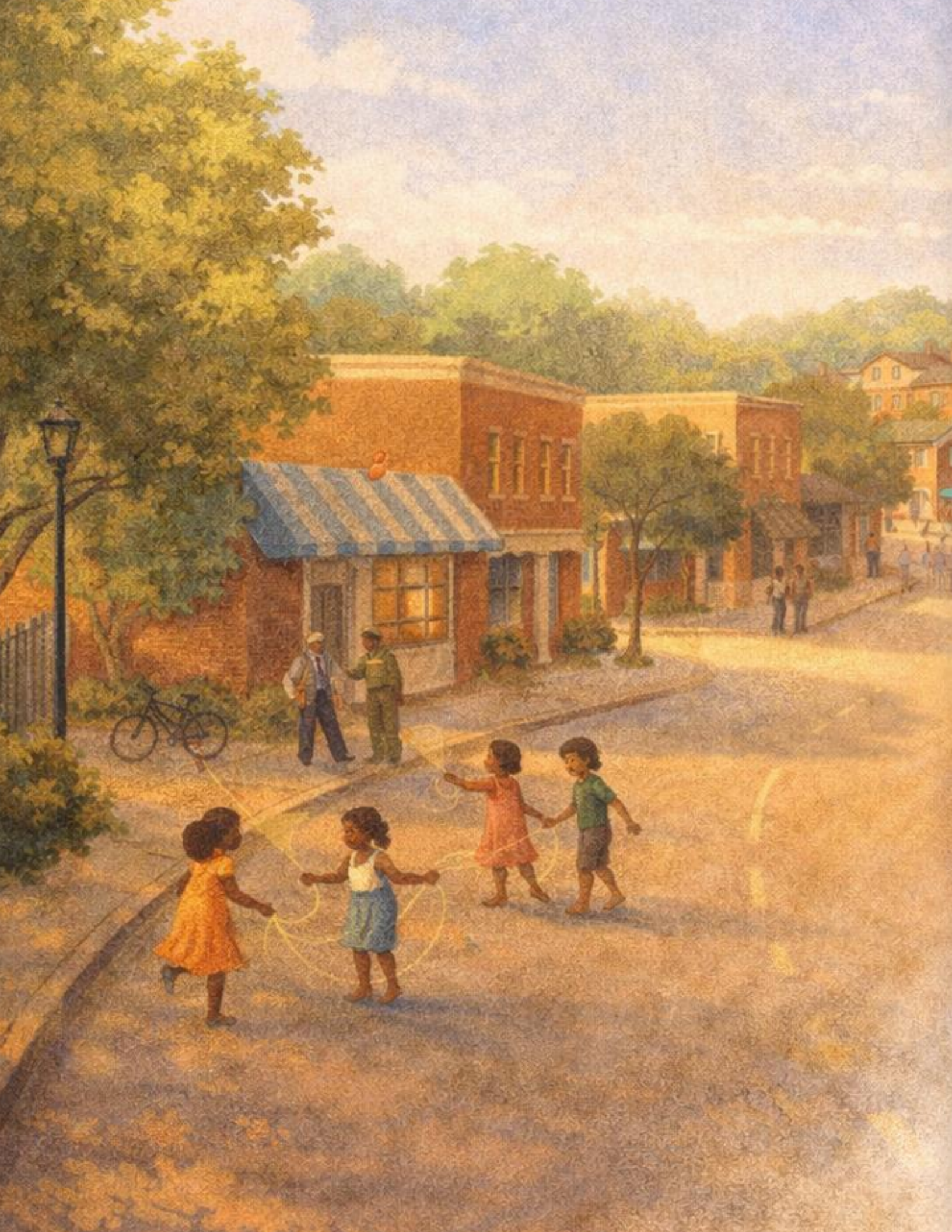

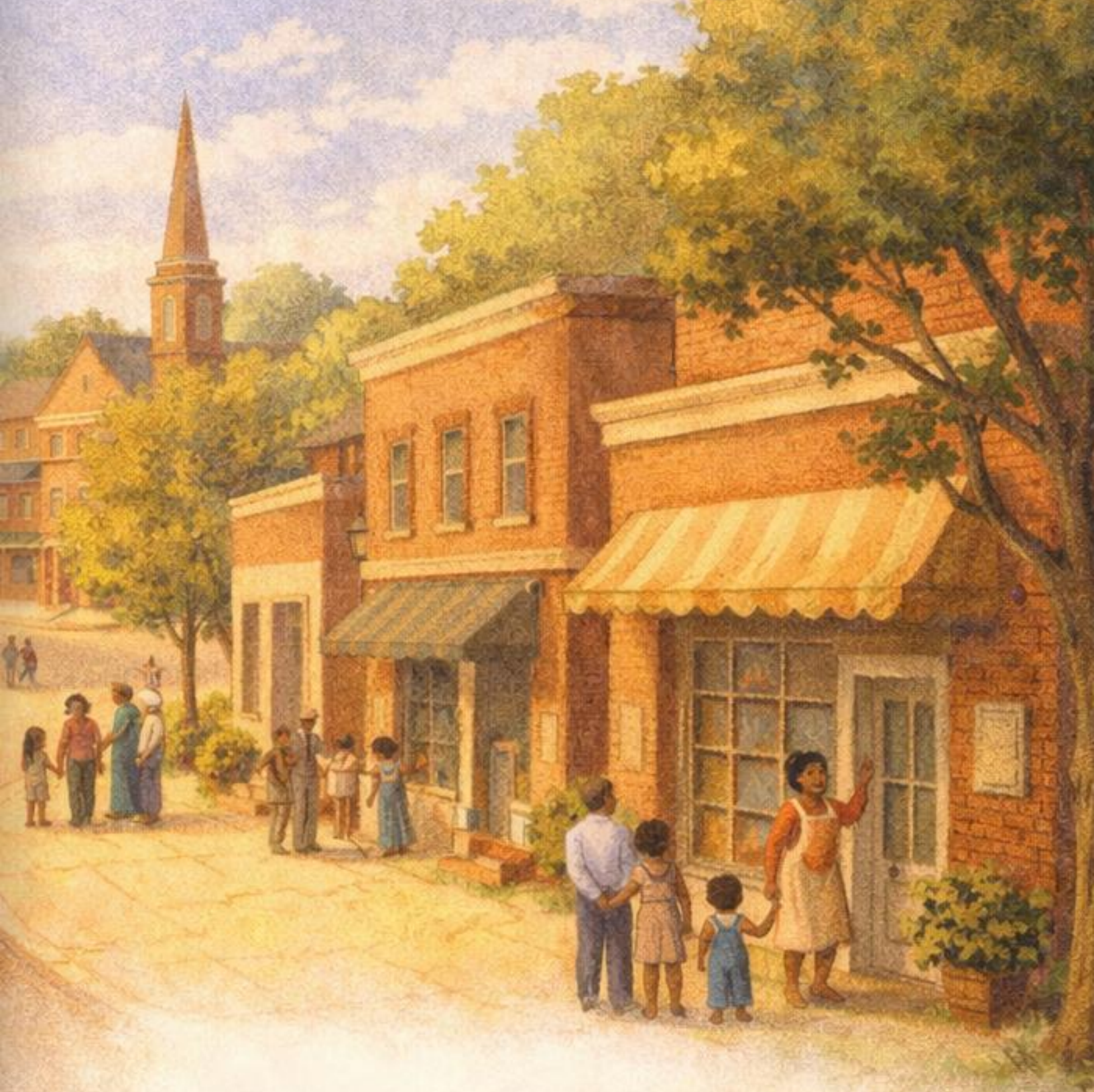
Author's Note (For Grown-Ups)

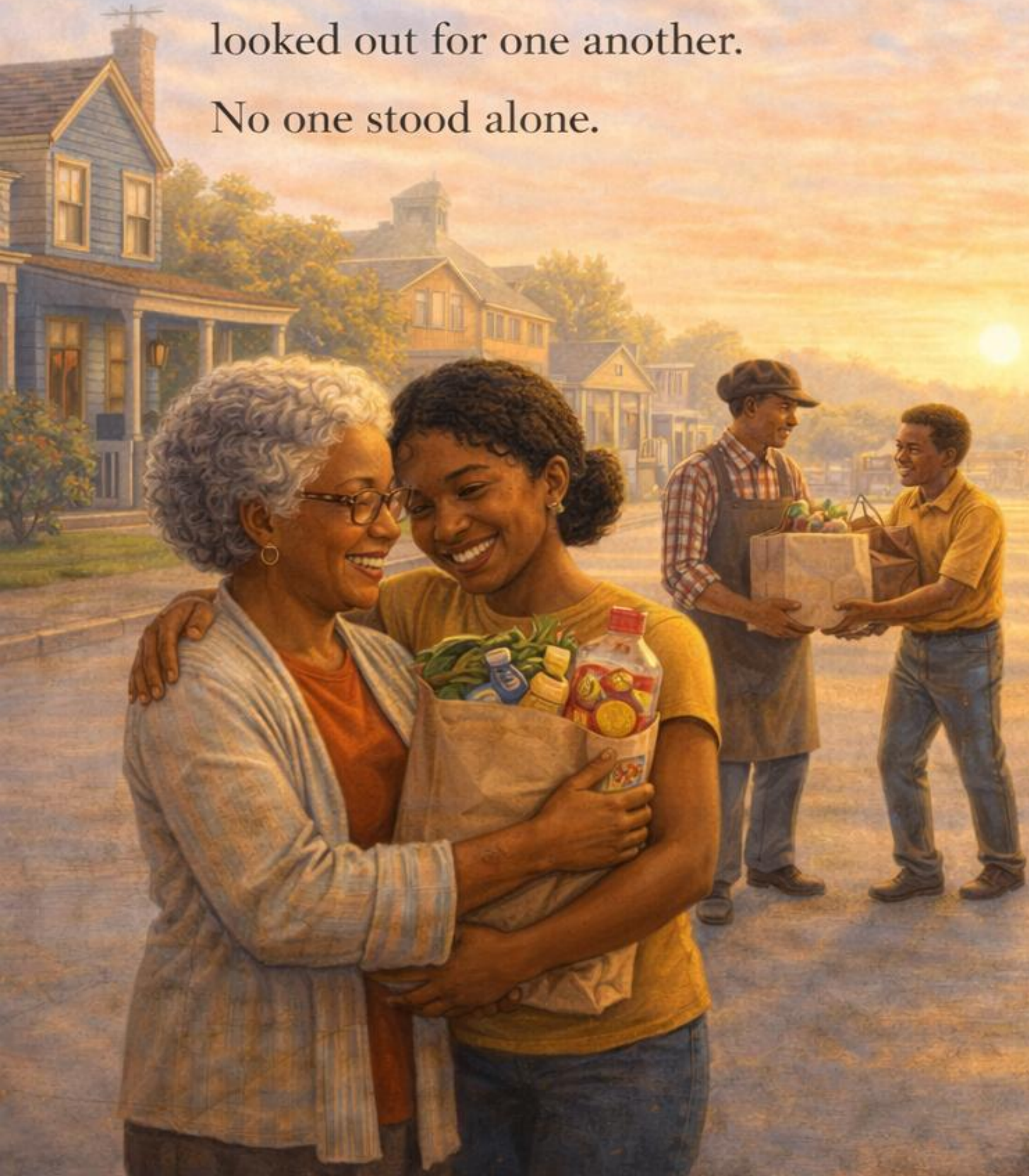

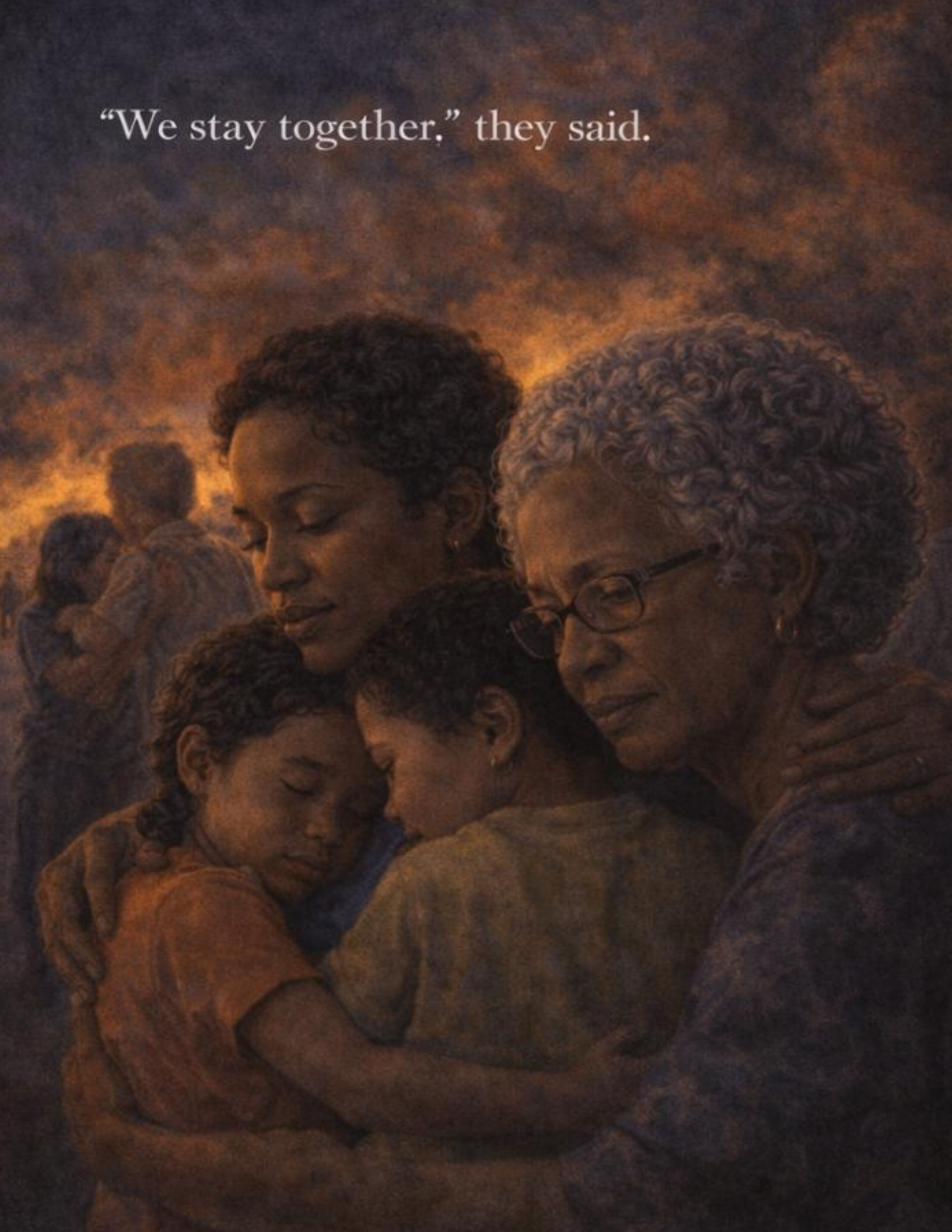

“We stay together,” they said.

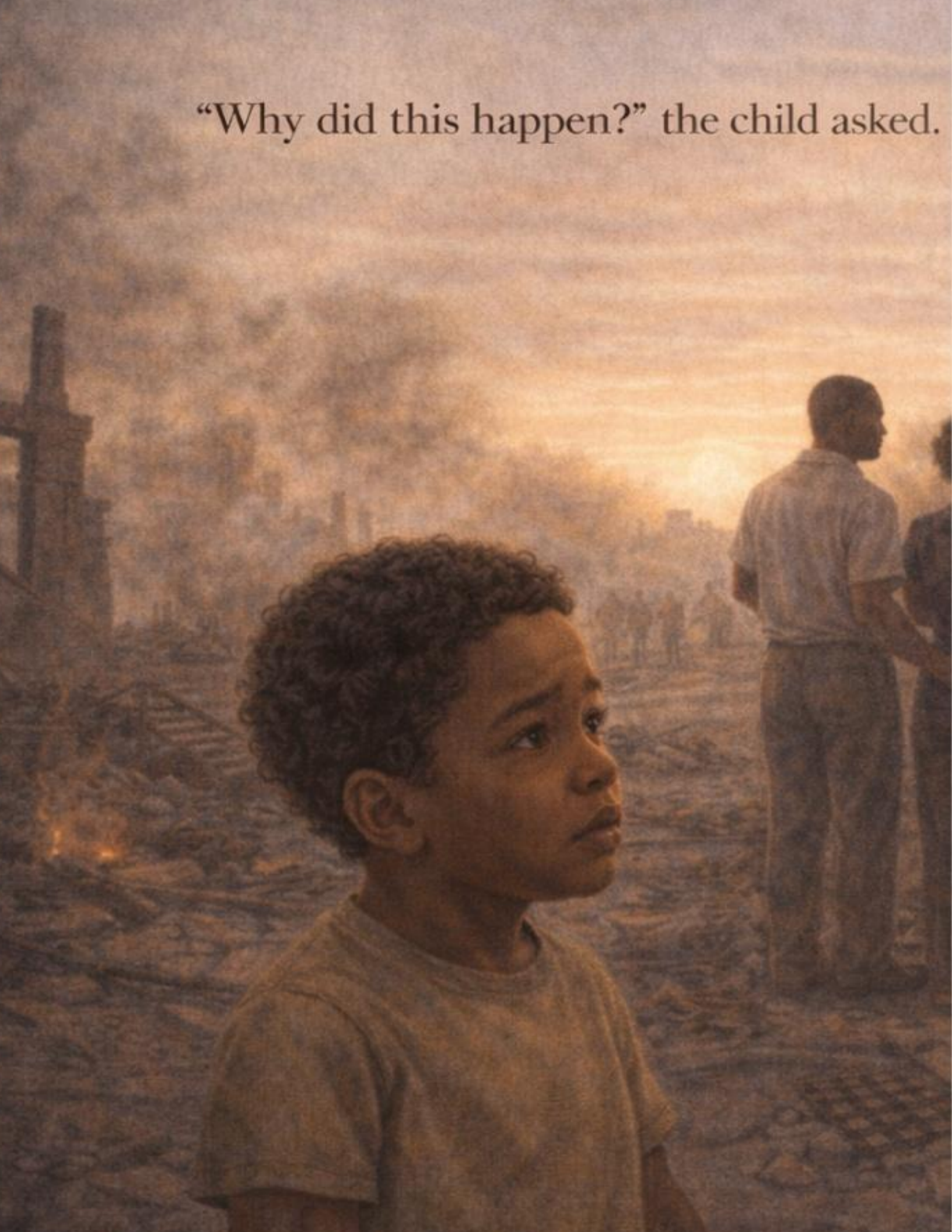


When morning came, the sun rose anyway.

“Some people made unfair and harmful choices,” a grown-up said gently.



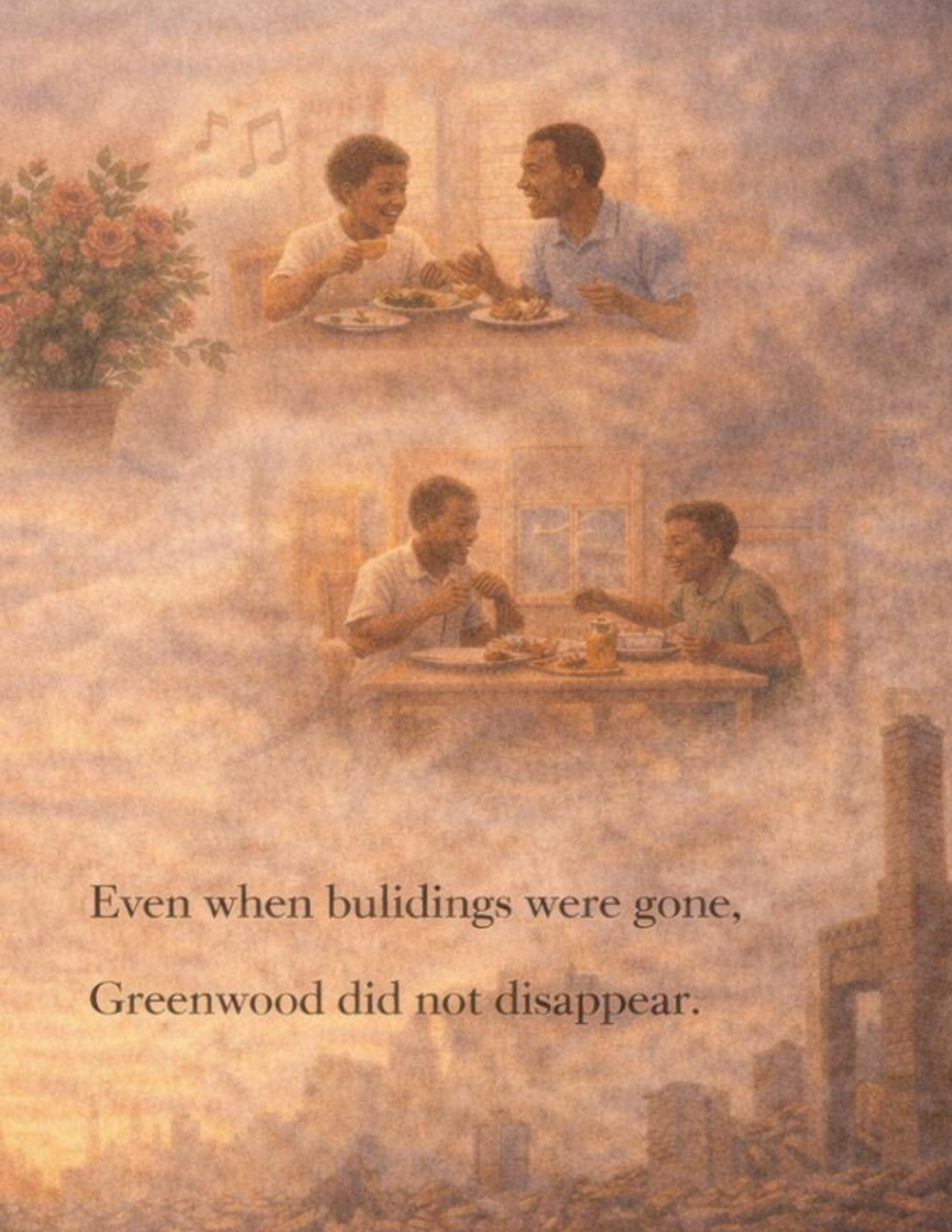
Neighbors helped neighbors.

Greenwood became a promise.



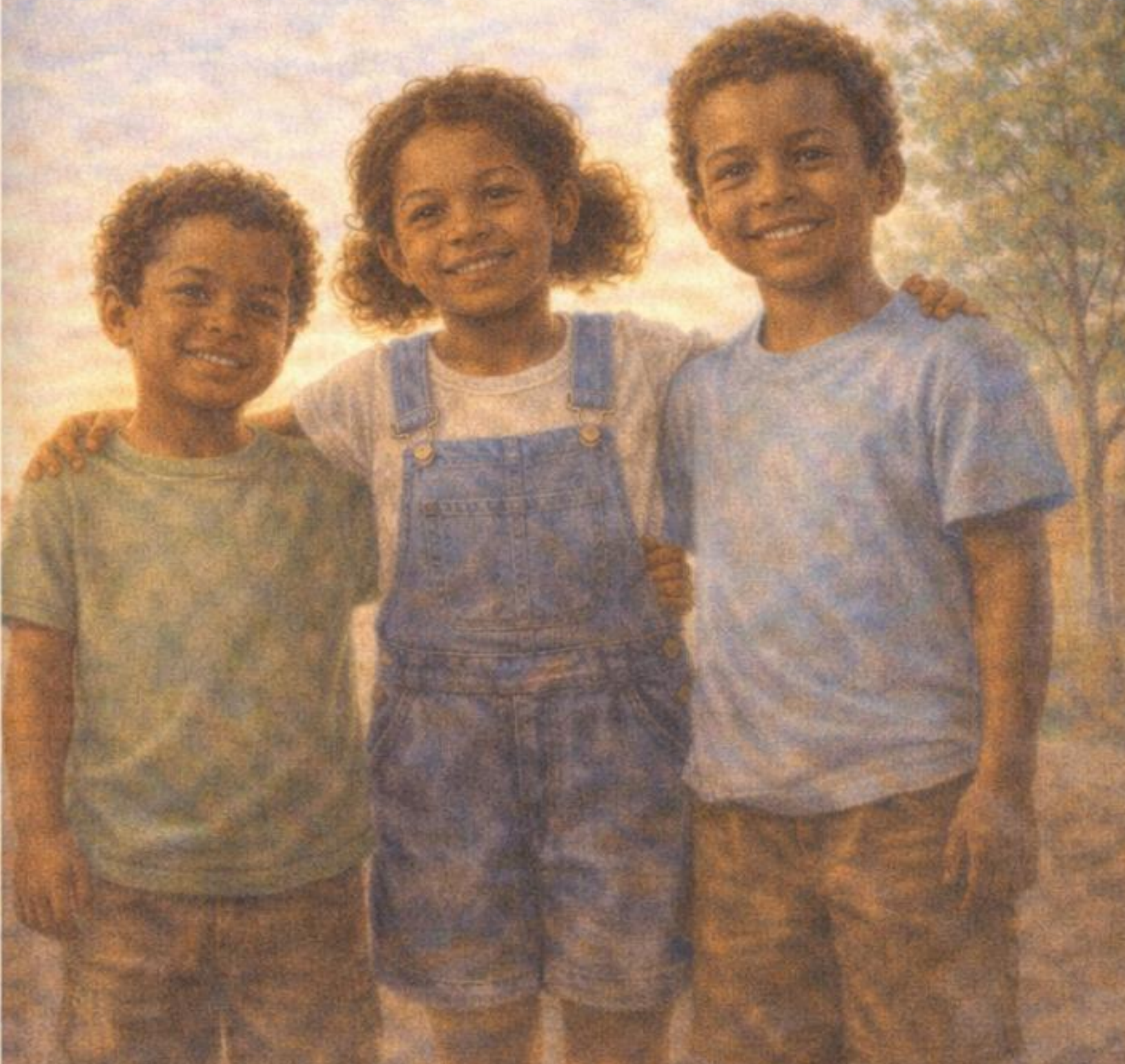
A promise of kindness, courage, and care.

Reflection Questions


1. What does “home” mean to you?
